On behalf of New York State Governor David Paterson, the Empire State Development Corporation, the Society of Foreign Consuls and the Foreign Trade Commissioners' Association in New York, it is my pleasure to invite you on a 2 day trade mission to Buffalo, New York on April 29-30, 2009.

Our trade mission to Albany this past February brought 33 foreign trade officials from 27 countries to the Capital Region. At this event, officials met the Governor and the First Lady at the Governor's Mansion, toured the region's economic and governmental resources, and networked with over 100 businesses. This Buffalo Mission will encourage international trade and investment cooperation and opportunities between members of foreign consulates and the leaders of business, political, and academic arenas in the Buffalo area (marked with red star).

Governor Paterson will host a dinner in Buffalo in honor of the trade mission, to which the Buffalo and regional business community will be invited. Empire State Development Corporation CEO Marisa Lago will also be accompanying the mission.

The total cost of this Mission will be \$375 per participant. This includes all costs -- round trip air fare, hotel accommodations, all ground transportation, and all meals, receptions, and the trip to Niagara Falls. The program includes strong emphases on **renewable energy** (visits to the Niagara Falls hydropower plant, a wind farm on a waterfront, and a showpiece Green building under construction), **life sciences** (a briefing by a Nobel Laureate at the NYS Center of Excellence for Life Sciences and a tour of America's first cancer institute), **education** (briefings at the University of Buffalo, which is one of the 10 most international universities in the U.S. by the number of foreign students), **agriculture**, and culture (lunch/sightseeing at the Niagara Falls).

We hope you will accompany us to establish strong ties and business ventures with Western and Upstate New York.
